On The Other Side of Grace | Ephesians 7

1. Last weekend Dave said it's not the job of the pastor/leader to do all the ministry, but rather to equip the people in the church to do ministry.

How is this similar or different from how you have typically viewed the role of the pastor/leader and those who attend?

2. When you hear that God has given you gifts and a calling for a specific "part to play" in ministry, what response does that elicit?

3. Our understanding of the "part we play" and our personal area of ministry can be confusing at times. Our calling to serve God shows up in two areas where we have a responsibility to do our part for God's kingdom. The first is in our daily life (how we live and interact with those around us) and the second is in support and service to God's people and his kingdom.

How do the following verses speak to your own vision and focus for your daily life ministry opportunities?

- Micah 6:8
- Matthew 22:37-40
- Colossians 3:13-14
- Colossians 4:5-6

How might this view of our ministry and service for God take the pressure off when it comes to ministry? How might it put the pressure on?

4. One of the keys to finding the specific "part to play" that God has designed for us is to simply start serving and see where we're effective and what we gain energy from.

What do the following verses tell us about the importance of every single ministry role?

- 1 Corinthians 12:4-7; 12-13; 21-26
